We are committed to being carbon neutral by 2030. We have worked hard to change 16,000 streetlights to LED and have the highest county recycling rates in the country for the 7th year in a row.

We have kept all 42 libraries, and opened 2 new ones in the last 12 months. We also have the home library service looking after those who are housebound.




Highways and transport success
