



# ANNUAL FLOWER & PRODUCE SHOW

**Saturday 12 September 2020**

**Memorial Hall, Charlbury**

**Show open from 2.00 - 4.00pm**

**Admission 50p (Children FREE)**

This is our largest show, featuring baking and crafts as well as many flower, fruit and vegetable classes. We also have children's classes and a family class. There is a range of wonderful cups to be won and good amounts of prize money, too. Details of the classes that have cups associated with them are noted in the Schedule.

The schedule can be a little daunting if you haven't exhibited before. Please take a moment to read the Exhibitors Rules inside the schedule and the Definitions page at the back. It is important to the judges that exhibits are "as schedule" and so the receptacle and size of entries is very important. There is information on the website about showing as well. There is always a class which is easy to enter, with material from your garden which can be picked on the day of the show. The Society tries to ensure there are people on hand to advise and assist at the shows so don't be put off entering.

Note that for **floral arrangements classes** you don't have to have grown the flowers yourself.

Our shows are continuing to flourish while many local shows are folding. The Society wishes to continue to enrich the life of Charlbury and so we encourage members and non-members to bake, sew, grow and enter our Annual Show.

## General Exhibition Rules

1. **With the exception of pot plants, flowers and materials used in arrangements, ALL EXHIBITS MUST HAVE BEEN GROWN BY THE EXHIBITOR.** The exhibitor need not have grown pot plants but they must have been in his/her possession for at least two months prior to the show.
2. Any protest must be made in writing to the Show Secretary before 3.30pm on the day of the show, together with a deposit of 50p, which will be refunded if the protest is considered justifiable by the Show Sub-Committee. The Show Sub-Committee may, if it upholds the protest, alter the decisions of the judge for that class.
3. All entries for handicrafts, cookery and photography classes **MUST BE THE WORK OF THE EXHIBITOR** and must not have been exhibited in any previous Charlbury and District Garden Society Show.
4. With the exception of the Spring Show, no exhibitor may enter more than one exhibit in each class.
5. Exhibits must be staged between 8.30-10.45am (9.30-11.00am for the Spring Show) on the day of the show and no exhibits may be altered after judging or removed before the end of the show without the Show Secretary's permission.
6. The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry and the Show Secretary's decision in this connection will be final.
7. The Committee will not be responsible for the loss of, or damage to, any exhibit or container.
8. Subject to the powers of the Show Sub-Committee laid down in Rule 2 the decision of the judges shall be final and they may, at their decision, reduce or withhold any prize if they consider there is insufficient competition or merit.
9. All cups are "Perpetual Challenge" and are awarded for one year. **THEY MUST BE RETURNED IN GOOD CONDITION TO THE SHOW SECRETARY A MONTH BEFORE THE SHOW CONCERNED.**
10. Where possible exhibitors should name varieties of exhibits shown.
11. A Novice is defined as any exhibitor who has not won in any class in that particular Show.

## DEFINITIONS

### DISH

**Not a type of container but a specified number of vegetables which may be displayed in a receptacle or on a board of any material or shape and which consists of one variety only.**

See the next page for the number of each vegetable to comprise a dish and the maximum points that could be awarded.

### BOWL

A vessel for displaying flowers in water that has a diameter that is equal to, or greater than, its height.

### VASE

A vessel for displaying cut flowers in water that is greater in height than the diameter of its mouth.

### CONTAINER

Any receptacle.

### KIND

A basic kind of plant, flower, fruit or vegetable e.g. chrysanthemum, rose, apple, plum, carrot or pea.

### VARIETY

A variation of colour or shape within the basic type of plant, flower, fruit or vegetable, e.g. "Ena Harkness", "Blenheim Orange" and "Kelvedon Wonder".

### SIZE

"Overall" means height, width and depth. (Be careful of drooping after setting your exhibit which can result in exceeding the size limit.)

### NOVICE

A **Novice** is defined as any exhibitor who has not won in any class in any Collection in the **Annual Show**.
